\$22 Million Capital Campaign

Ronald McDonald House Charities Saskatchewan (RMHC-SK) is embarking on a provincial campaign to raise \$22 million to support the health of families across the province.

The capital campaign is all about expanding our reach to serve more families throughout the province.

The funds raised will support the construction of two new houses; a 12-room house in Prince Albert to support families in the north, and a 20-room house in Regina to support families in the south.

"We need to get closer to the people that require the services," says Tammy Forrester, CEO of RMHC-SK. "It's not just about one centralized model, it's about expanding our reach and going to the need rather than waiting for the need to come to us."

An RBC study found that RMHC-SK is currently saving families over \$2 million annually in out-of-pocket expenses. With the expansion and additional support for families that number will increase to over \$6 million annually.

"I look forward to new programs becoming alive in these new locations to really support families, enabling family-centered care," says Forrester. "At Ronald McDonald House, we wrap our arms around the family and support them while they're supporting the child."

Our Commitment to REDI

Reconciliation, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (REDI) are commitments RMHC-SK has made, and are more than words!

"As we evolve, we know our journey will be ongoing", says Kelly Humphrey, Human Resource Assistant and REDI committee chair. "We will never get to a place where we think we have done all that we need to do."

Part of RMHC-SK's evolution involved the creation of a REDI committee. The committee consists of staff members from each department, bringing different perspectives and knowledge around family needs. The committee ensures RMHC-SK stays consistent in its messaging and actions.

"It's important to take an organizational look at all families' needs and how we can help families feel safe, seen and included," shares Humphrey. "Safety and comfort is part of how RMHC-SK helps support families."

Moving forward the organization will continue to further strengthen its commitments to REDI in support of all communities Ronald McDonald House serves throughout the province.

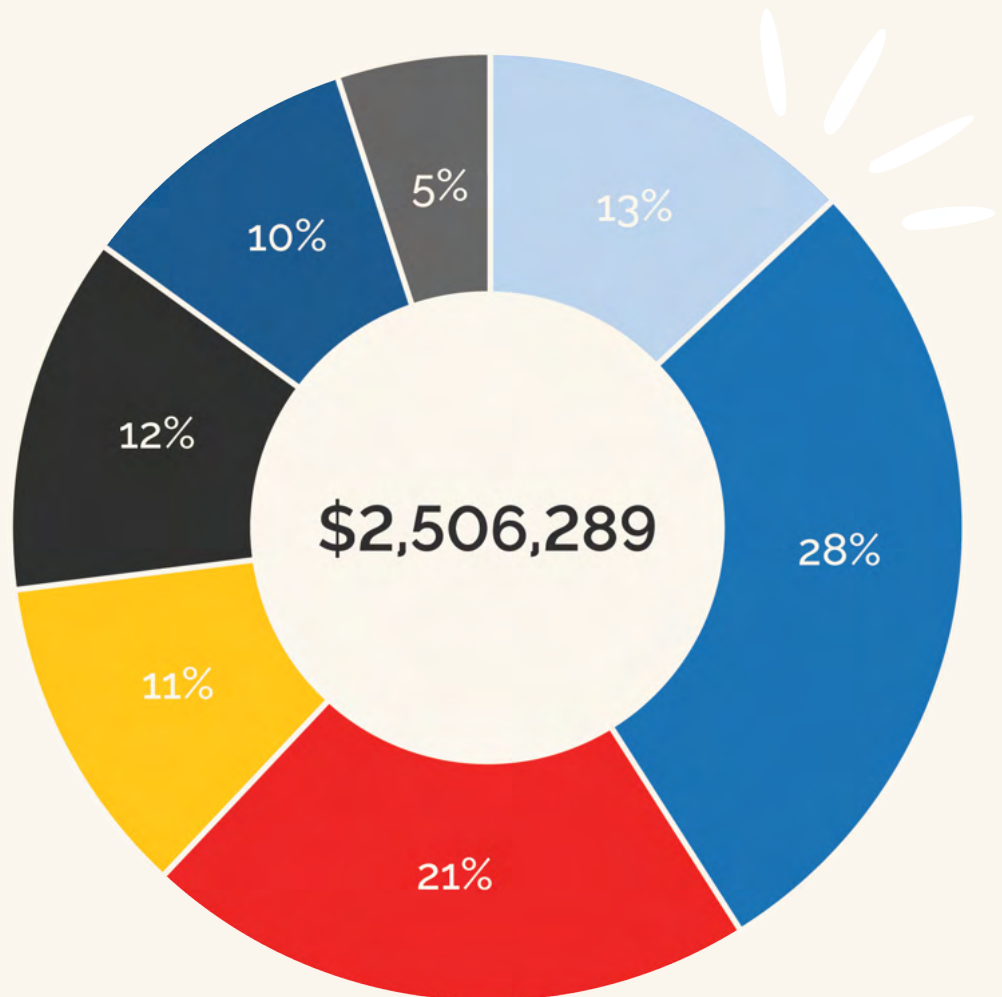

The Threinen Family

150 nights and counting | Creighton, SK

"Anytime we get close to Ronald McDonald House Max says, 'Max's house, Max's house, I want to go to Max's house.'"

Max Threinen was diagnosed with a rare form of leukemia called MPAL, or mixed phenotype acute leukemia, just before his second birthday. He had been sick for quite some time and it was getting progressively worse. Max went in for blood work and his results were completely out of whack. On March 7, Max and his parents, Nicole and Todd, were flown to Saskatoon ICU.

Nicole and Todd live in Creighton, Saskatchewan with their two sons, Leo, 4 and Max, 2. Since Creighton is six hours North of Saskatoon, the family has had to stay at the Ronald McDonald House for over 150 days, with many more days ahead.

"We were kind of leery at first," shares Nicole. "We had heard of Ronald McDonald House, but we'd never been to one. My mom and I came and took a tour and right away we were completely floored at how amazing this place was. They have thought of everything you could possibly need."

Nicole and Todd's son Leo stays at home with his grandparents, but comes to visit his family at the Ronald McDonald House every two weeks.

"My son Leo is autistic, and finding an environment that is good for him is sometimes really hard. But he treats this place like it's his home - he's super comfortable here."

Nicole praises Ronald McDonald House for playing such a vital role in her family's physical and mental health.

"When he first got discharged from the hospital, Max wasn't walking because he had been bedridden for about 5 to 6 weeks," shares Nicole. "Within a couple days of being at Ronald McDonald House, he started walking. His strength came from seeing the other kids and playing downstairs. That just shows what this place does to a child that's going through something medical. It's a happy place and it makes them feel comfortable."

From Saturday Bingo to craft nights, Easter holidays to birthdays, the Threinen family has celebrated a lot at the House. Nicole says that the relationships they've built with staff and volunteers has been a very special part of their experience.

"I could list every single staff member that works here. From the cleaning staff to the CEO to the volunteers. Every single one of them says, 'Good morning Max, how are you?'" Every single one of them."

They've also built special bonds with other families that have stayed at the House.

"I've made pretty close friendships with moms going through the same thing," says Nicole. "I know these are going to be friends that we're going to have for a long time. They're going to be people that are now a part of our family."

Ronald McDonald House is all about keeping families together and that's what they've done for The Threinen family. While Max continues his medical journey he has a place to come to that feels like home.

Volunteers make all the difference

Volunteering has a deep and lasting impact, not just on the families, but on the people who choose to share their time with Ronald McDonald House in Saskatoon and the Family Room in Prince Albert.

"We hear our volunteers say their time spent volunteering is as fulfilling for them as it is beneficial for the families they care for," says Deanne Praski, Volunteer Manager.



The mission of Ronald McDonald House is to provide family-centered care to families with sick children, which positively impacts the health and wellbeing of the entire family. This mission is carried out by every single person who is a part of the RMHC-SK team, including volunteers.

"It takes a team to support families," says Praski. "Our volunteer team consists of an average of 200 volunteers that give their time caring for families' day-to-day needs and ensuring their well-being is taken care of."

Volunteering is personal and each person brings their own set of unique skills and experiences, which all positively impact the families that are served.

Some of the important areas that volunteers assist with include family programming, guest experience, events, gardening, and the food program - which is the largest supported volunteer program. Essentially, if you think of the work we all do in our own homes to run a household, that is what our volunteers do for families at the House in Saskatoon and the Family Room in Prince Albert.

"The support we are able to give families is truly amazing and could not be accomplished in the same way without our volunteer team," says Praski. "To our volunteers, we are grateful for your dedication, time, compassion, care and willingness to do whatever is needed. We sincerely and truly could not complete the meaningful work we do without all of you."

Family Programming

Programming for families continues to hold a special place in the House. Throughout the last year, family programming has continued to grow and flourish, with increased participation in all programs.

Ronald McDonald House Saskatchewan offers **14 different programs** for families staying at the House.

"The focus in 2023 was on patient siblings and how to build connections within families," says Dorianne Dodge, Director of House Operations Saskatoon. "Through Forest School camps during the summer months, and cooking classes in Fall, this year is all about connection and relationships."

Various food programs including Home for Dinner, Breakfast Program and Lunch Program help keep families nourished during what might be a challenging time.

"Food Programs have been the highlight of 2023, with the addition of many community partners to ensure success," says Dodge. "As Saskatchewan families are facing increased financial costs due to inflation in a number of areas, families are more reliant on the programs provided by the House and Family Room."

Through these family-focused programs, families have an opportunity to connect with one another, and enjoy time together as a family unit. It also allows them to build relationships with other families who might be going through a similar situation - someone who understands the experience of supporting a child in the hospital.



Food Programming

Offering families the ability to return from a long stressful day at the hospital to a home-cooked meal is one of the most important ways that RMHC-SK supports families staying at the House. The food programs provide families with healthy meals to keep them strong and let them focus on what matters most - supporting their child.

The food programs are consistently evolving to keep up with the needs of families and make them feel at home.

"We've added more culturally diverse ingredients to our community pantry," says Cesar Roblin, Food Programs Coordinator. "This in coordination with our REDI committee helps create a more inclusive and welcoming atmosphere for all guest families."



Roblin hopes to continue widening the options of ethnic ingredients in the pantry so that families feel represented and welcomed.

He also hopes to bring what he's learned here to the new Houses in Prince Albert and Regina, recognizing the importance and impact of food programming on the family experience.

"I have seen every part of the food programs make an impact on families," shares Roblin. From taking away the stress of what they will need to cook to feed their loved ones to the financial relief we provide to all of guest families by having food in our community pantry 24/7."

The Gayatenia Family

14 nights | Swift Current, SK

Armando and Cherry Ann Gayatenia live in Swift Current with their three children, Armando III, 10, Aryann Marie, 7 and Amari Grace, 3.

When Amari was just one year old she was diagnosed with DiGeorge syndrome. In children with this syndrome, a small piece of chromosome 22 is missing, causing a variety of health problems.

The Gayatenia family had to travel to see medical specialists, taking them away from home. They had heard about Ronald McDonald House in Saskatoon from friends, and it was also recommended by one of the nurses at the hospital.

"The staff was great and the house was very clean," shares Armando. "Our kids loved the play areas in the House and always enjoyed a trip down to the fun forest."

The family stayed at the House for a total of 14 nights, but the impact has lasted much longer.

"It felt like home. All the necessary needs were there," says Armando, reflecting on how the staff went above and beyond, helping them to celebrate their other daughter's 6th birthday while Amari was in the hospital.

Since leaving, the Gayatenia's have had many conversations with other families about the House and the imprint it has left on them.

Thank you Schroeder Family!

Kaylynn and Darrell Schroeder have been actively involved with Ronald McDonald House Charities Saskatchewan for many years. Kaylynn was the chairperson of the board from 2012-2016 and Darrell was a volunteer at the House with facilities.

During his time volunteering Darrell connected with families and experienced first-hand the impact that the House has on a person.

"It was so unique," he shares. "There was no place else that I had ever heard of or seen that was doing this kind of work for people who are thrown into a whirlwind when their child gets sick. And here is Ronald McDonald House, staffed with absolutely wonderful people that would do anything for you."

Kaylynn had the opportunity to stock the quilt closet when she was there and shares how that resonated with her deeply.

"These quilts were all made lovingly by someone who donated them to the house. And as I was folding them and putting them in there, I'm thinking, 'One of these quilts is going to go home with somebody and they're going to wrap that quilt around themselves, and that's going to be their safety blanket after they leave.' So for me, that quilt room was always special."

Even though the Schroeders are not at the House volunteering currently, they are still regular donors and have even named Ronald McDonald House Charities Saskatchewan as a beneficiary in their will.

They encourage others to give what they can - whether that be time or a small monetary donation.

"We didn't start as donors giving big money," says Kaylynn. "We started small. And then as time went on we've increased our donations. But it's really not about that. It doesn't matter how much you can give, it's the fact that you're giving back in whatever way you can."

Kaylynn and Darrell also encourage people to go take a tour of the House if they're able.

"The House is special. It will speak to you in whatever way it needs to speak to you, and it will show you what the House actually does. It's so true to its mission that you can feel it when you're there."



The Ronald McDonald House Family Room, Prince Albert

The Ronald McDonald Family Room in Prince Albert provides 1,200 sq. ft of comfortable living space for families who have a sick child in the hospital.

Located on the Pediatric floor of the Victoria Hospital, the room provides families with access to a computer and desk, kitchenette, bathroom and shower facilities, living room with TV and fireplace, three napping nooks, laundry facility, and complimentary snacks and beverages.

As an extension of the Ronald McDonald Family Room, in September 2022 we were proud to launch two unique and first-of-its-kind programs in Saskatchewan - the NICU Food Program and the Hospitality Cart.

Within 3 months 686 lunches were prepared, individually packed and delivered to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit to feed families of babies receiving care.

In addition, more than 80 parents and caregivers of babies were supported through the Hospitality Cart Program.



Food and meals provided by RMHC-SK play a huge role in reducing family stress, easing the financial burden and, more importantly, providing strength and energy to care for their sick children and babies. We're thrilled to expand this support to even more Saskatchewan families.

The Home for Dinner program is a wonderful gift for families, providing kindness and support during a very stressful time in their lives.

This group volunteer activity plays a significant role in creating a warm and comfortable environment for families. Volunteers have the opportunity to act as an ambassador of the House as they work closely with our team to provide meals for our guests. We value teamwork and collaboration and are so grateful for every person that helps make Home for Dinner possible.

Adopt-a-Room

The Adopt-a-Room Program allows an individual, a company, or an organization to be the exclusive partner of one of the guest rooms at Ronald McDonald House. This contribution provides direct support for guest room upkeep and operations so families can have a place they call home while they are away from theirs.

The cost of adopting a room is \$10,000 a year for a minimum of three years and can be paid annually or all at once. Donors receive three years of recognition with the option for renewal after 3 years.
