Our mission is to provide programs that improve the health and wellbeing of the entire family. Programs are based on volunteer availability and may be offered seasonally. Check-in with staff to inquire about availability or to provide feedback.

AROUND THE COFFEE TABLE

A safe and supportive space to share and connect with one another. Caregivers are invited to join a Social Work student from CFS Saskatoon for informal conversation.

ART WITH KIDS

Meet Linda, An expressive art therapist, in the dining room for engaging art projects for all ages. Check out our Multi-Purpose room at the end of the main floor hallway for more fun crafts and activities every day of the week.

BINGO

Come play Bingo with us in the Dining Room. There are lots of fun prizes to be won!

FAMILY CONNECTIONS

Staff from Family Service Saskatoon are on-site to discuss family-focused education topics and offer related resources.

FOOD PROGRAMS

Breakfast Program: Weekday mornings 7:30-9:00am and Sunday mornings.

Grab and Go Lunches: Nutritional lunch items are prepared fresh daily and available in the Community Pantry for you to pack for your day or night at the hospital.

Home for Dinner: Join families and staff in the dining room on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings for a home cooked meal. Staff and volunteer groups are happy to support this program.

FOREST SCHOOL

Tykes and Tots Forest School is a truly unique learning experience for children aged 3-15 years to engage with open-ended play in nature, learn to identify animal tracks, build shelters, and care for their surrounding environment. Children will learn how to safely use and care for tools, learn about very basic survival (like what to do if you become lost), and will have a chance to play with their peers inside of a nature-first environment.

KIDS CARE

Free childcare for children of all ages are offered on-site by Tykes and Tots Early Learning Centre. Visit the Family Service Office to sign up.

PET THERAPY

Join Dibs and handler, Taunia, and spend time with a St. John's Ambulance trained Therapy Dog!

SELF-CARE NIGHT

Students from MC College will be on-site twice each month to provide mini-manicures, hand massages, and hair styling for families.

SHUTTLE PROGRAM

The RMHC-SK Shuttle Program is volunteer run, and provide free and safe transportation to clinic, hospital, or grocery stores. This program runs weekdays 7:30-10am and 4-6pm.

STORIES WITH UNCLE LYNDON

Join Uncle Lyndon, an Indigenous Knowledge Keeper, for a coffee chat or some storytelling.

WELLNESS BAGS

If this is your first time staying at RMHC-SK, you likely received a Wellness Bag from the Family Service team when you first arrived. These bags are filled with items that we hope support your wellness while you care for your sick child.

COMPUTER COMMONS

Common computers available for use just off of the kitchen. We also have a Nintendo Switch and laptop available for loan. Let us know if you need anything printed!

GARDEN NEXT DOOR

Enjoy quality time outdoors in our beautiful gated garden across the parking lot. Help yourself to fresh produce and let us know if you want to help with any of the gardening.

MASSAGE CHAIR

Located on the 2nd floor landing of the spiral staircase, the massage chair is a great place to relax and unwind. Adults only please!

MEDIA ROOM

Located at the south end of the House on the lower level, the Media Room is a great place to hang out, play board games, video games or watch a movie.

MOTHERS' ROOMS

Located on the 2nd and 3rd floors off of the south elevator, the Mothers' Rooms are private spaces for new moms. Each room contains a breast pump, rocking chairs, and a freezer to store your breast milk. Come see us in the Family Service Office if you require an attachment kit for the breast pump.

OUTDOOR PLAYGROUND

A fun place to hangout outside. Access the playground through the kitchen side doors to the patio.

QUIET ROOM

Our quiet room is located on the second floor landing of the spiral staircase at the south end of the House. This is a space to relax, take space, and connect. Close the door, enjoy the sunshine, pray, journal, or whatever helps you to nurture your own spiritual health.

ROWDY PLAYROOM AND KITCHEN PLAY AREA

Our House has two designated indoor play areas for children: near the north kitchen on the main floor, and just off the north elevator on the lower level. Both areas include toys and space for kids to be kids. Please ensure children are supervised at all times.

SHARED KITCHENS AND LIVING AREAS

Make yourself at home in our two large shared kitchens and five living spaces throughout the House. We know that a sense of normalcy is part of what is lost when you need to travel for your sick child's treatment. We hope that spaces to cook and relax will help regain some sense of normal for you and your family.

Medical social workers are available at each of the hospitals in Saskatoon. As part of your child's medical team, a medical social worker offers support through counselling, assistance navigating the medical system, connection to resources, and discharge planning.

By helping to address emotional and social difficulties, a medical social worker can enhance your hospital experience and strengthen your ability to advocate for your families needs. A medical social worker may come to meet with you as part of your routine care while you're in the hospital.

You can also reach out by phoning the social work office mainline yourself.



Prior approval is required. Your specialist must ask for prior approval from the Medical Services Branch of Saskatchewan Health or from the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency.

If the treatment is approved, Saskatchewan Health will pay the full cost of treatment at a rate that the Saskatchewan Ministry of Heath considers fair and reasonable after taking into account the location where the insured service is provided.
