# RMHC Anniversary

**October 15, 2024 marked the 50th Anniversary of Ronald McDonald Charities worldwide. An amazing milestone of supporting families around the globe.**

In July of this year, several of the RMHC – SK team traveled to Chicago for the RMHC Global International conference in celebration of the milestone 50th Anniversary event. Over 1,700 delegates from around the world traveled to Chicago to celebrate the journey of serving families globally, recognizing the legacy of Dr. Audrey Evans, founder of Ronald McDonald House, Philadelphia and the first House in the global system opening in 1974.

Included in the conference itinerary was the opportunity to attend the private screening of the Hollywood movie Audrey's Children, which was a critical reminder of the origin of this global mission. Dr. Audrey Evans' vision to build a place to accommodate and support families is significant to be told and reminded of, as we serve families here in Saskatchewan and continue to grow province-wide.

Ronald McDonald House started as a critical support service for families, by a doctor who saw first-hand what would have a significant impact on outcomes for children – Keeping Families Close® and providing a place for families to lay their heads during days of uncertainty.





The impact this place has on the medical journey of families and their children should never be overlooked, underplayed or taken for granted.

Each day, when volunteers and staff greet families, we are working as a community to make someone's day a little bit brighter and hopefully a little lighter. The support and care provided by this community that wraps their arms around each family served, is a bright light in perhaps the hardest and darkest days these families will experience.

Dr. Audrey Evans had a vision and a dream; 50 years later we are here, continuing to serve in a way that is truly a gift to families in this province.

This year we celebrate 50 years of RMHC Global.

Next year we will celebrate 40 years of RMHC-SK and in 2026 we will bring additional support services to families in Northern and Southern Saskatchewan, with the building of two new Houses.

We have embarked on a journey to double our footprint and capacity, which in turn doubles the impact we can have on families across our province. Your support to build a 20-room House in Regina and a 12-room House in Prince Albert will enable us to blanket the province with care.

We are truly grateful that this vision was cast 50 years ago. We are part of an amazing, family-focused, grassroots, community-minded, healthcare support system. Thank you for taking the journey with us!

Anytime we come close to the Ronald McDonald House, Marilee gets all excited and begs to go to the House.

Marilee was born to Andy & Kristi and lives in Ruthilda, Saskatchewan with her four siblings, Tydus, Zackary, Emily and Noah. Marilee was born with a heart condition called Tetralogy of Fallot and severe pulmonary stenosis. She has been diagnosed with Beaulieu-Boycott-Innes syndrome, and quite a few other health issues.

When Marilee was 5 days old she was airlifted to Edmonton, Alberta for her first open heart surgery at 10 days old. Many complications and other health issues have resulted in lots of hospital stays for us. We spent 8 months in the Ronald McDonald House in the first year of her life.

# The Ronald McDonald House Family Room Prince Albert



Celebrating 8 Years!

In September 2016, Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC-SK) opened its first Ronald McDonald Family Room in the Pediatric Unit of Prince Albert's Victoria Hospital. This 1,300-square-foot haven offered families in northern Saskatchewan a comforting space to rest, recharge, and find support while staying close to their children receiving medical care. Since its opening, The Family Room has provided more than just basic amenities—it has become a true extension of Family-Centered Care.

Over the past eight years, this Family Room has supported thousands of families, delivering comfort and stability during challenging times. One of those families was Adam Pearson's. Adam, a father of triplets, was present at the ribbon cutting of the Family Room in 2016. Today, he serves as the Director of Maternal & Children's Provincial Programs North, witnessing firsthand the continued positive impact of the space on families and the pediatric healthcare community.

The success of The Family Room is a testament to the strong collaboration between RMHC-SK and the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA). This partnership has cultivated an approach to healthcare that prioritizes family well-being. Looking to the future, the SHA will welcome a new and expanded Ronald McDonald Family Room as part of the redevelopment of the Victoria Hospital. This new space, in coordination with the

new Ronald McDonald House being built in Prince Albert, will ensure that families from all pediatric units and from all across northern Saskatchewan will have access to essential support services, regardless of their situation.

As we celebrate eight years of wrap-around support, we are reminded of the thousands of families who have found relief, warmth, and community in The Family Room. RMHC-SK and SHA remain dedicated to ensuring that healthcare experiences are rooted in family-centered care, providing comfort, compassion, and a sense of home when families need it most.

# Family Programs

**As our founder, Dr. Audrey Evans said “A family with a sick child, is a sick family”- and we know that in order to support your loved ones, you require both physical and mental strength.**

Through generous Community Partnerships we are able to support Family-Centered Care with our in-House programming. Each program is designed to foster connection, alleviate stress, and promote mental and physical wellness for those participating. These four featured programs are offered in partnership with community organizations and businesses to provide connection, comfort, and relief.

## Family Connections and Around the Coffee Table

‘Family Connections’ and ‘Around the Coffee Table’ programs offer families a chance to gather, share their experiences, and find emotional support. Whether connecting with a youth counselor or a social work student, caregivers can decompress and discuss their day in a safe, non-judgmental environment. Families are able to find support in building emotional resilience, their parenting strategies while reducing feelings of isolation and enhancing their emotional well-being.

## KidsCare

In Partnership with a local Early Learning Centre, families have access to free, professional and on-site childcare. This program allows caregivers to leave their other children in a safe and engaging environment while they take time for themselves to rest, enjoy a quiet meal alone, reconnect with their partner, or spend one-on-one time with their child at the hospital. This much-needed break enhances their ability to return to their caregiving roles with renewed energy and peace of mind.

## Massage Therapy

After seeing the impact of RMHC on a family member, a local massage therapy clinic came forward to offer discounted off-site massages, and free monthly in-House massages for families who feel more comfortable in a familiar environment. Families have shared their appreciation numerous times, as these opportunities have provided them with a chance to unwind, release built-up tension and relax.

**By prioritizing mental and physical wellness, we ensure that every family member—whether they are caring for a loved one or navigating their own emotions—gets the care they need to face the challenges ahead.**

At Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC-SK) Saskatchewan, we understand that when families face challenging medical situations, their most pressing concerns should be about their child's well-being, not where their next meal will come from. That's where our Food Programs team steps in, offering not just meals, but also comfort, community, and care.

Each meal is thoughtfully prepared to meet the diverse needs of the families we serve. From home-cooked dinners to grab-and-go snacks, we provide a variety of options to suit preferences and dietary restrictions. The focus is on fresh ingredients, balanced meals, and the comforting flavours of home, things that are often hard to find when families are away from their own kitchens.

One of our flagship initiatives is the "Home for Dinner" program, where volunteer groups prepare and serve dinner for the families staying at the House. This program allows families to come together over a shared meal, offering a moment of relief and connection during stressful days. The communal dinners help create a warm, familial atmosphere, giving guests the opportunity to interact and support each other.

A cornerstone of our Food Programs is the involvement of volunteers. This program would not be possible without their contribution. Every meal served in the House and Family Room is a testament to the kindness of the local community. Volunteers from all backgrounds—individuals, families, and corporate groups—generously donate their time and cooking talents to prepare meals for our guests.

From whipping up a hearty soup or baking a batch of cookies, each contribution makes a difference. This community-driven effort not only nourishes families but also fosters a sense of belonging.

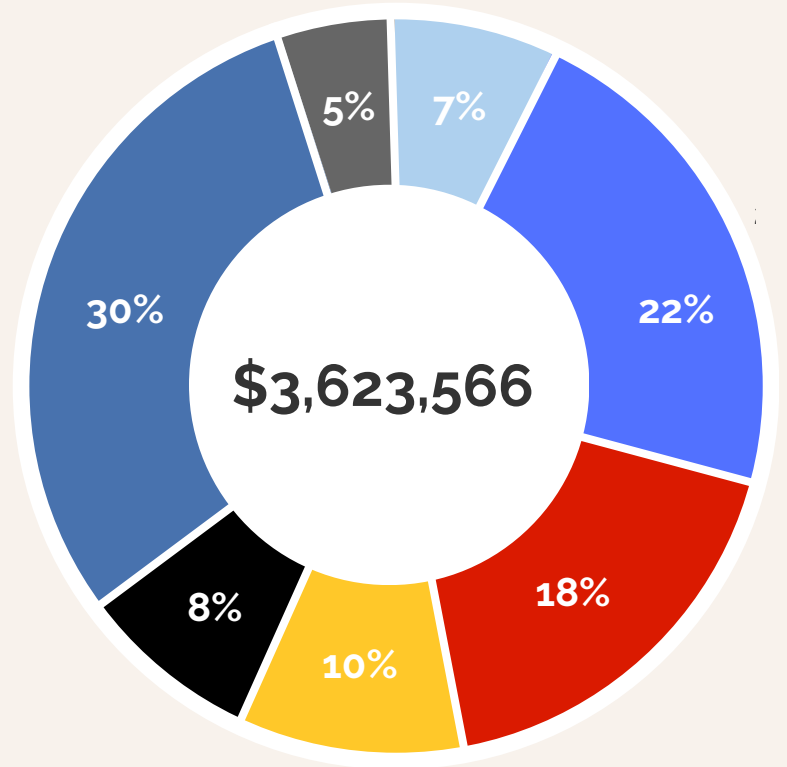
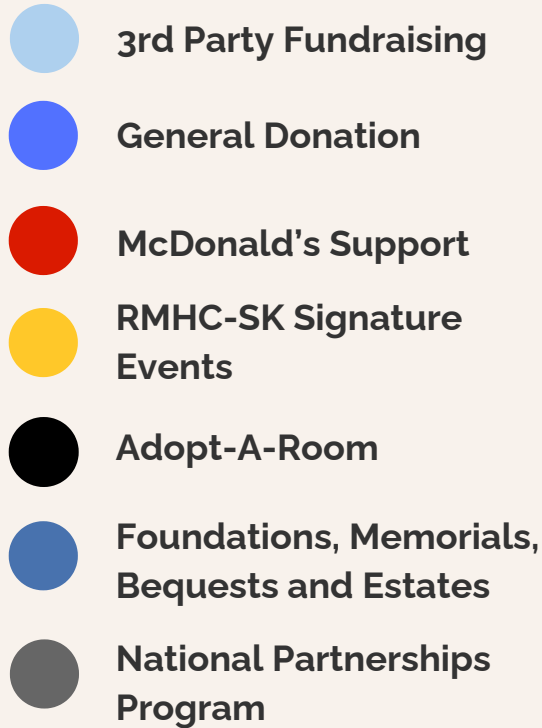
